From the Rabbi...

Numbering Our Days

Teach us to number our days that we may gain a heart of wisdom - Psalm 90:12.

When do we number our days? Sometimes in anticipation of something wonderful - 10 more days 'til the family gathers for a holiday, 8 more weeks until summer vacation, 3 months until the wedding. Sometimes we count down to events we dread - surgery next month, project due next week, taxes due tomorrow. Some countdowns evoke complex and competing feelings, because they will bring changes that might be joyful but will also herald significant changes in our lifestyle - children going off to college, retirement looming, moving to another part of the country.

But are these the kinds of counts from which the psalmist means us to learn and grow? We are called always to be present in our surroundings, aware of our every moment, always focused on the people and environment at hand. Some kinds of counting lead us to wish our days away, thereby reducing our attention and presence along the way. Perhaps the "countdowns" listed above are not those that lead to enlightenment and wisdom.

In our Jewish year, we are offered a couple of significant periods of counting. In the late summer, a time of abundance and vigor, we begin the process of *teshuvah*, turning back, for the entire month of Elul, leading us toward the reckoning of the High Holy Days (I've mentioned this in earlier articles, and will likely visit it again this summer).



Presently, we are in another period of counting: the span of time between the 2nd day of Passover and Shavuot, known as the Omer. Our ancestors shared a hurried slaves' meal that first Passover, and left the next day as free men. They then walked into the wilderness, where they encamped and prepared themselves to receive the Torah at the foot of Mount Sinai. The moment of revelation occurred on Shavuot, 7 weeks later (Shavuot means "weeks"). We count each day, from the 2nd day of Passover until Shavuot as the "omer." Our ancestors used this time to prepare themselves, physically and spiritually, to receive the word of God.

How can we use this time today? The kabbalists suggest that each of the weeks should focus on one of seven soul traits – week one focuses on *chesed*, mercy; subsequent weeks focus on justice/discipline, harmony/compassion, endurance, humility, bonding, sovereignty/leadership. Having a directed focus for each day of the omer allows us to engage, for at least a few minutes, in reflection on our inner life and gives us purpose and direction as we prepare for Shavuot (or simply for our own personal, spiritual growth).

I've been reading Rabbi Karyn Kedar's *Omer: A counting*, which contains meditations, and the blessing for counting the omer, for each of the 49 days. I also have left the accompanying deck of cards (one for each day) on my desk – please feel free to browse them anytime you're in the temple over the next 7 weeks.

Jewish mourning is both private and public. When we visit a grave or observe a [yahrzeit](#) [the anniversary of a person's death], we generally do so in private. Yizkor is the public observance for the community of bereaved.

Traditionally, Yizkor services are offered four times a year, at Yom Kippur and the three pilgrimage festivals of Sukkot, Passover, and Shavuot. At TEMV, we've typically only offered this service at Yom Kippur, but we wished to offer at least one additional opportunity this year to remember our beloved ones.

Please join us on Friday, **June 10**, for a Shabbat evening service which will include a short Yizkor service of remembrance.
