From the Rabbi...

Lighting up the Dark

I do not adore the winter months. As the cold moves in, my enthusiasm moves out. Surely there are many things to enjoy in winter: holiday gatherings with friends and family, pretty snowfalls, hot chocolate, ice skating, school cancellations, the cheery



generosity of strangers, and twinkling lights on the neighbors' houses. But many, particularly in the Northeast and other cold locales, also feel the winter blahs, and, like some other mammals, experience the desire to hibernate, eat too much, and just snuggle in until springtime.

How do we fight the winter doldrums, and dispel the darkness? By bringing light, creating light, and being light.

Bring Light

Chanukah is a gift of light at the darkest moment of winter, falling close to the winter solstice, and beginning on a waning moon. Just when our hope may be weakest and our fear greatest, the chanukiah is lit, our joy is restored and our resolve strengthened. Below are some resources to consider for your own Chanukah observances:

Gifts: share gifts with friends and family, but also set aside some of your budget for caring for those less fortunate, supporting social justice organizations, and sustaining your beloved community institutions.

Connection: Share some of your Chanukah joy with others – bring jelly donuts to work, read a Chanukah storybook with your child's class, celebrate with our friends at Peace Islands Institute (details elsewhere in this bulletin).

Create Light

There are so many ways our world needs to be illuminated. Get involved in a project or cause that is important to you.

Be Light

If you suffer from SAD (seasonal affective disorder), this can be difficult, but do what you can muster the energy to do. Set aside time for self-care. When those early sunsets make 5p feel more like 9pm, have a party in your pjs with children or friends or pets, or a good book. Go outside and stand in the sunshine. Inspire others. Find a reason to be grateful each day.

From the President

I began my tenure as president of TEMV's Board of Trustees by conveying the difficult news that our finances are in poor condition and that we may have to take drastic action to continue as a viable congregation. Shortly thereafter, we had a visioning meeting so that we could hear what about TEMV is important to the you, the members, and begin to explore our options. After that, we convened a task force so that the options could be investigated and recommendations could be made to the board. All the while, the board has been in deep discussion with each other, with other members of the community, and with developers and real estate agents about what we can do to turn our challenges around.

In the meantime, we continue to hold services, run a religious school, provide a space for social events like Mah Jong and yoga, and provide assistance to many in our small community and the larger one in which we live. We have an outstanding rabbi and amazing members who are incredibly warm, passionate and giving. I heard many, many accolades from visitors and friends about our services and the people of our community during the High Holy Days. We love our temple and it shows.

However, our financial woes continue because of a long-term drop in membership over the last decade. At the current rate of income and expenses, even with our very lean budget, we will run out of operating funds before the fiscal year is over in April. The members of the board have explored every idea they and the community have come up with that will increase our income to cover our needs. Many of you have as well. It is very much appreciated. But the answers are not easy, nor are they quick.

The board is wrestling with incredibly difficult decisions. We expect to come to a resolution before the end of December. Please know that we want only the very best for our congregation. We are not looking for an ending, but for a new beginning.

For those of you who are able to contribute financially, we thank you for giving generously at a time when it matters more than ever. We need more than this, however. We need people to help us explore the options we have, to help us with laying the groundwork for whatever the future may bring. If you would like to help, or if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me. Many thanks in advance for all you do and have done to make TEMV the warm and welcoming place that it is.

Together, we can make a difference to sustain our community --- a community that has already sustained and nourished so many of us.


